EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Each year, the Immunization Program releases school and child care immunization audit reports. Local Public Health Agencies (LPHAs) conduct audits of immunization records for students enrolled in licensed child care centers and public, private and parochial students in kindergarten through 12th grade each year. Assessments are conducted to ensure attendees receive required immunizations and have a valid Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption, or Provisional Certificate of Immunization.

School Immunization Audit Highlights - 2022-23 School Year

- **Total Enrollment:** Records from 523,155 students attending lowa schools were analyzed to calculate statewide vaccination coverage levels.
- Valid Immunization Certificates: 98.9% of students attending lowa schools had valid immunization certificates, indicating 517,478 records of Certificates of Immunization, Certificates of Immunization Exemption, or Provisional Certificates of Immunization complied with Iowa law.
 - By grade, the percent of students with valid immunization certificates ranged from 97.6% to 99.5%.
 - The percent of students with valid immunization certificates increased from 98.8% in the 2020-21 school year to 98.9% in the 2022-23 school year.
- **Certificates of Immunization:** 94.2% of students attending lowa schools had valid Certificates of Immunization, indicating 492,977 records met age-appropriate immunization requirements.
 - By grade, the percent of students with Certificates of Immunization ranged from 87.1% to 96.5%.
 - The percent of students with Certificates of Immunization decreased from 94.3% in the 2021-22 school year to 94.2% in the 2022-23 school year.
- **Provisional Certificates of Immunization:** 1.8% of students attending lowa schools had Provisional Certificates of Immunization, indicating 9,459 students received at least one dose of each of the required vaccines but did not complete all required immunizations or have transferred from another U.S. school system.
 - o By grade, the percent of students with Provisional Certificates ranged from 0.6% to 7.5%.
 - The percent of students with Provisional Certificate decreased from 1.9% in the 2021-22 school year to 1.8% in the 2022-23 school year, which is a decrease of 619 records.
- Certificates of Immunization Exemption Medical: 0.2% of students attending lowa schools had medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption, representing 1,281 students.
 - By grade, the percent of students with medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption ranged from 0.1% to 0.5%.
 - The percent of students with medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption decreased from 0.3% in the 2021-22 school year to 0.2% in the 2022-23 school year, which is a decrease of 144 records.
- Certificates of Immunization Exemption Religious: 2.6% of students attending lowa schools had religious Certificates of Immunization Exemption, representing 13,761 students.
 - By grade, the percent of students with religious Certificates of Immunization Exemption ranged from 2.0% to 3.2%.
 - The percent of students with religious Certificates of Immunization increased from 2.3% in the 2021-22 school year to 2.6% in the 2022-23 school year, which is an increase of 1,779 records.
- Invalid or No immunization Certificates: 1.1% of students attending lowa schools had invalid or no immunization certificates, representing 5,677 students.
 - o By grade, the percent of students with invalid or no certificates ranged from 0.5% to 2.4%.

- The percent of students with invalid or no certificate decreased from 1.2% in the 2021-22 school year to 1.1% in the 2022-23 school year, which is a decrease of 488 records.
- **Under or Un-immunized:** 5.8% of students attending lowa schools were under or un-immunized, representing 30,178 students with a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption, or an invalid or no certificate.
 - By grade, the percent of under or un-immunized students ranged from 3.5% to 12.9%.
 The percent of students with invalid or no certificate increased from 5.7% in the 2021-22 school year to 5.8% in the 2022-23 school year, which is an increase of 528 records.

BACKGROUND

Annually, the Immunization Program releases school and child care audit reports. LPHAs conduct audits of immunization records for children enrolled in licensed child care centers and public, private and parochial students in kindergarten through 12th grade each year. Assessments are conducted to ensure attendees receive the required immunizations and have a valid Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption, or Provisional Certificate of Immunization. Iowa Code, Chapter 139a.8(6) and Iowa Administrative Code, 641-7.7(139) outline immunization requirements to attend licensed child care centers and elementary or secondary schools. To attend school or licensed child care, the child needs to present a valid Certificate of Immunization, Provisional Certificate of Immunization, or Certificate of Immunization Exemption (Medical or Religious) to the admitting official. A brief explanation of each certificate is included below.

- **Certificate of Immunization** Issued when the applicant has a record of age-appropriate immunizations that meet the requirement for licensed child care or school enrollment.
- **Provisional Certificate of Immunization** Issued when the applicant has received at least one dose of each of the required vaccines but has not completed all required immunizations or is a transfer student from another U.S. school system.
- Certificate of Immunization Exemption-Medical lowa law allows for medical exemption to immunization when the required immunizations would be injurious to the health and wellbeing of the applicant or any member of the applicant's family or household or the required vaccine would violate minimum interval spacing.
- Certificate of Immunization Exemption-Religious lowa law allows for religious exemption to immunization when immunizations conflict with a genuine and sincere religious belief, and is not based merely on philosophical, scientific, moral, personal or medical opposition to immunizations.

Data files contained in this report are available on the Immunization Program webpage at http://hhs.iowa.gov/immtb/immunization/audits. In 2019, the Immunization Program began to collaborate with the Iowa Public Health Tracking Program to include immunization data for childhood, adolescent, human papillomavirus (HPV), influenza and school and child care audits on the Iowa Public Health Tracking Portal. SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION AUDIT DATA -KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 12TH GRADE

Local Public Health Agencies conducted audits of immunization records for 523,155 students enrolled in 1,562 of lowa's public, private and parochial schools during the 2022-23 school year. The audit data were analyzed to calculate statewide vaccination coverage levels.

For students in kindergarten through 12th grade during the 2022-23 school year:

- 98.9% of students had valid Certificates of Immunization, Certificates of Immunization Exemption, or Provisional Certificates of Immunization and were compliant with Iowa law (517,478 records).
- 94.2% of students had valid Certificates of Immunization and received all required vaccines (492,977 records).
- 5.8% of students were under or un-immunized (30,178 records).
- 1.8% of students had Provisional Certificates of Immunization (9,459 records).




Figure 1. Percent of Immunization Certificates by Type, Kindergarten - 12th Grade, Iowa, 2006-07 to 2022-23

- 1.1% of students had invalid or no certificates (5,677 records) (Table 1 and Figure 1).

Kindergarten - 12th Grade - Provisional Certificate of Immunization

- During the 2022-23 school year, 1.8% of students in kindergarten through 12th grade had a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, representing 9,459 students.
- Provisional Certificates of Immunization decreased from 1.9% (10,078 records) during the 2021-22 school year to 1.8% (9,459 records) during the 2022-23 school year (Table I and Figure I).

Kindergarten - 12th Grade - Certificate of Immunization Exemption

- During the 2022-23 school year, 2.9% of students in kindergarten through 12th grade were reported to have a Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 15,042 students (Figure 2).
- Of the 15,042 exemptions, 91.5% (13,761 records) were categorized as religious and 8.5% (1,281 records) were categorized as medical.
- The number of Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 12.2% (1,635 records) from the previous year and 30.0% (3,568 records) since the 2018-19 school year.

Medical Exemptions:

- During the 2022-23 school year, 0.2% of students in kindergarten through 12th grade had a medical Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 1,281 students and a slight decrease from the previous year.
- Both the number of medical exemptions and the percent of students with this exemption slightly decreased from the previous school year.
- The number of medical Certificates of Immunization Exemptions decreased 25.7% (442 records) since the 2018-19 school year.

Religious Exemptions:

- During the 2022-23 school year, 2.6% of students in kindergarten through 12th grade had a religious Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 13,761 students and an increase from the previous year.
- The number of religious Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 14.8% (1,779 records) from the previous year and 39.7% (3,910 records) since the 2018-19 school year.

Kindergarten - 12th Grade - Under and Un-Immunized

- During the 2022-23 school year, 5.8% of students in kindergarten through 12th grade were under immunized and includes children who have an invalid or no certificate, Provisional Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption (30,178 records) (Table 2).
- The number of under and un-immunized students increased 1.8% from the previous assessment year, which is an increase of 528 records.
- A percent increase in under immunized students was observed in the number of religious Certificates of Immunization Exemption (14.8%). Percent decreases in under immunized student were observed for medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption (-10.1%), invalid or no certificates (-7.9%) and Provisional Certificates (-6.1%).

Figure 2. Number and Percent of Exemptions by Type, Kindergarten - 12th Grade, Iowa, 2017-18 to 2022-23



SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION AUDIT DATA - KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS

During the 2022-23 school year:

- 98.2% of lowa kindergarten students had valid Certificates of Immunization, Certificates of Immunization Exemption, or Provisional Certificates of Immunization and were compliant with Iowa law (38,482 records).
- 89.9% of lowa kindergarten students had valid Certificates of Immunization and received all required vaccines (35,239 records).
- 10.1% of kindergarten students were under or un-immunized (3,939 records).




Figure 3. Percent of Immunization Certificates by Type, Kindergarten, Iowa, 2012-23 to 2022-23

- 1.8% of enrolled kindergarten students had invalid or no certificates (696 records) (Figure 3 and Table 5).

Kindergarten Students - Provisional Certificate of Immunization

- During the 2022-23 school year, 5.3% of kindergarten students had a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, representing 2,070 students.
- The number of Provisional certificates decreased 3.5% (76 records) from the previous year but has increased 68.6% (842 records) since the 2018-2019 school year.

Kindergarten Students - Certificate of Immunization Exemption

- During the 2022-23 school year, 3.0% of kindergartners were reported to have an exemption, representing 1,173 students (Figure 4).
- Of the 1,173 exemptions, 1,105 (94.2%) were categorized as religious and 68 (5.8%) as medical.
- The number of Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 21.9% (211 records) from the previous year and 22.2% (213 records) since the 2018-19 school year.


Medical Exemptions:

- During the 2022-23 school year, 0.2% of kindergarten students were reported to have a medical Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 68 students.
- The number of medical Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 38.8% (19 records) from the previous year but decreased 21.8% (19 records) since the 2018-19 school year.

Religious Exemptions:

- During the 2022-23 school year, 2.8% of kindergarten students were reported to have a religious Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 1,105 students.
- The number of religious Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 21.0% (192 records) from the previous year and 26.6% (232 records) since the 2018-19 school year.

Kindergarten Student - Vaccination Coverage by School Type

- During the 2022-23 school year, kindergartners enrolled in public schools had a higher percentage of Certificates of Immunization and Provisional Certificates of Immunization, and lower percentage of invalid or no certificates and Certificates of Immunization Exemption compared to their peers enrolled in private schools.
- The statewide coverage levels for all vaccinations required at school entry in private and public schools was 94.0% and 98.6%, respectively, as represented by valid Certificates of Immunization.
- During the 2022-23 school year, 6.7% of kindergarten students enrolled in private schools reported an exemption, compared to 2.7% enrolled in public schools.
- During the 2022-23 school year, 15.6% of kindergarten students enrolled in private schools were under or un-immunized, compared to 9.6% enrolled in public schools (Table 6).

Kindergarten Students Under and Un-Immunized

- During the 2022-23 school year, 10.1% of kindergarten students were under or un-immunized and includes students with a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption, or an invalid or no certificate, representing 3,939 students.
- The number of under and un-immunized students increased by 4.4% from the previous year (165 records) and 43.8% (1,199 records) since the 2018-19 school year.
- The largest percent increase in under and un-immunized students was observed in the number of medical Certificates of Exemption (38.8%), followed by religious Certificates of Immunization Exemption (21.0%) and invalid or no certificate (4.5%) (Table 7).

SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION AUDIT DATA 7TH GRADE STUDENTS

lowa currently has two additional immunization requirements for all students entering, advancing or transferring into 7^{th} grade, which may affect vaccination coverage:

- Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, all students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade require proof of an adolescent tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough) booster immunization (Tdap) for school enrollment.
- Beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, all students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade and born after September 15, 2004, require proof of one dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MenACWY).

Compared to other grades in the 2022-23 school year, 7th grade students were reported to have:

- Lowest percent of valid Certificates of Immunization at 97.6% (39,006 records)
- Highest percent of Religious Certificates of Immunization Exemption at 3.2% (1,266 records)
- Highest percent of invalid or no certificates at 2.4%, (956 records)

During the 2022-23 school year:

- 97.6% of 7th grade students had valid Certificates of Immunization, Certificates of Immunization Exemption, or Provisional Certificates of Immunization and were compliant with Iowa law (39,006 records).
- 92.1% of 7th grade students had Certificates of Immunization, which is the statewide coverage level for all vaccinations required at school entry (36,800 records).
- 7.9% of children were under or un-immunized (3,162 records).




Figure 5. Percent of Immunization Certificates by Type 7th Grade, Iowa, 2018-18 to 2022-23

- 2.4% of 7th grade students had invalid or no immunization certificates (956 records) (Figure 5 and Table 8).

7th Grade Students - Provisional Certificate of Immunization

- During the 2022-23 school year, 2.1% of 7th grade students had a Provisional Certificate of Immunization (836 records).
- The number of Provisional Certificates decreased from 2.4% (954 records) during the 2021-22 school year to 2.1% (836 records), which is a 12.4% decrease (Figure 5 and Table 8).

7th Grade Students - Certificate of Immunization Exemption

- During the 2022-23 school year, 3.4% of 7th grade students were reported to have an exemption, representing 1,370 students (Figure 6).
- Of the 1,370 exemptions, 1,266 (92.4%) were categorized as religious and 104 (7.6%) as medical.
- The number of Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 13.1% (159 records) from the previous year and 36.7%% (358 records) since the 2018-19 school year.


Medical Exemptions:

During the 2022-23 school year, 0.3% of 7th grade students were reported to have a medical Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 104 students.

Religious Exemptions:

During the 2022-23 school year, 3.2% of 7th grade students were reported to have a religious Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 1,266 students.

7th Grade Students - Under and Un-Immunized

- During the 2022-23 school year, 7.9% of 7th grade students were under or un-immunized (3,162 records), as indicated by a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption, or an invalid or no certificate.
- The number of under and un-immunized students decreased 1.6% from the previous year and 38.2% since 2018-19 school year.
- A percent increase in under immunized students was observed in the number of religious Certificates of Immunization Exemption (14.7%) while percent decreases were observed in the number of Provisional Certificates (-12.4%), invalid or no certificate (-8.7%) and medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption (-2.8%) (Table 9).

SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION AUDIT DATA 12TH GRADE STUDENTS

lowa has an additional vaccine requirement for students enrolling in 12th grade. Beginning with the 2017-18 school year, all students entering, advancing or transferring into 12th grade and born after September 15, 1999 need proof of two doses of meningococcal (A, C W, Y) vaccine (one dose received on or after 16 years of age); or one dose if received when the student was 16 years of age or older. This vaccine requirement has directly affected the immunization audits for 12th grade students.

Compared to other grades in the 2022-23 school year, 12th grade students were reported to have:

- Lowest percent of Certificates of Immunization at 87.1% (34,753 records)
- Highest percent of Provisional Certificates of Immunization at 7.5% (2,995 records)
- Highest percent of medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption at 0.5% (182 records)
- Highest percent of under and un-immunized students at 12.9%, (5,127 records)

Figure 7. Percent of Immunization Certificates by Type, 12th Grade, Iowa, 2018-19 to 2022-23



- During the 2022-23 school year, 7.5% of 12th grade students had a Provisional Certificate of Immunization (2,995 records).
- The number of Provisional Certificates decreased from 8.4% (3.335 records) during the 2021-22 school year to 7.5%, which is 10.2% decrease (Figure 7 and Table 11).
- Twelfth grade accounted for 31.7% of all Provisional Certificates issued to K-12 students.

12th Grade Students - Certificate of Immunization Exemption

- During the 2022-23 school year, 3.0% (1,186 records) of 12th graders were reported to have an exemption.
- Of the 1,186 exemptions, 1,004 (84.7%) were categorized as religious and 182 (15.3%) as medical (Table 10 and Figure 8).
- The number of Certificates of Immunization Exemptions increased 12.4% (131 records) from the previous year and 46.8% (378 records) since the 2018-19 school year.

Medical Exemptions:

 During the 2022-23 school year, 0.5% of 12th grade students were reported to have a medical Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 182 students.


Religious Exemptions:

 During the 2022-23 school year, 2.5% of 12th grade students were reported to have a religious Certificate of Immunization Exemption, representing 1,004 students.

12th Grade Students - Under and Un-Immunized

- During the 2022-23 school year, 12.9% of 12th grade students were under or un-immunized (5,127 records), as indicated by a Provisional Certificate of Immunization, Certificate of Immunization Exemption, or an invalid or no certificate.
- The number of under and un-immunized students decreased 7.5% from the previous year but increased 58.3% since the 2018-19 school year.
- A percent increase in under immunized students was observed in the number of religious
 Certificates of Immunization Exemption (19.0%) while percent decreases were observed in the
 number of invalid or no certificate (-17.5%), medical Certificates of Immunization Exemption
 (-13.7%) and Provisional Certificates (-10.2%) (Table 11).

SUMMARY

State vaccination requirements for child care and school entry are important tools for maintaining high vaccination coverage rates and in turn, lower rates of vaccine-preventable diseases. While immunization rates in lowa are consistent with or exceed national averages, pockets of under and un-immunized children leave themselves and their communities vulnerable to vaccine-preventable diseases. While the data in this report demonstrate trends, school audit data do not provide a full picture of all children's immunization history. Vaccination and exemption status reflects the child's status at the time of the audit. Some children may be in the process of receiving required vaccines and final vaccination or exemption status may change after completion of the audit (Provisional Certificates, Medical Exemptions and invalid records). In addition, some students with Religious Exemptions may have received some of the required vaccines.

All states allow for medical exemptions, five states do not allow religious exemptions and four (California, Mississippi, New York and West Virginia) do not allow exemptions for religious or philosophical reasons. Iowa law allows for medical and religious exemptions. Iowa's 2022-23 exemption rates are comparable to available national data from the 2021-22 school year (Table 12).





Appendix 1. Percent of Students Kindergarten through 12th Grade with a Certificate of Immunization by County, Iowa, 2022-23 School Year




Appendix 2. Percent of Students Kindergarten through 12th Grade who are Under or Un-immunized by County, Iowa, 2022-23 School Year








Appendix 5. Percent of Kindergarten Students with a Certificate of Immunization by County, Iowa, 2022-23 School Year


Appendix 7. Percent of Seventh Grade Students with a Certificate of Immunization by County, Iowa, 2022-2023 School Year


Appendix 8. Percent of Seventh Grade Students who are Under or Un-immunized by County, Iowa, 2022-2023 School Year
